#### 1) ATTENDANCE

#### 2) DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST AND DISPENSATIONS

a) *Susie Caney advised an interest in the outcome of item 3a) and it was agreed she would remain and speak as a member of the public only.*

#### 3) PLANNING:

- a) 21/00384/FUL – 2 new houses behind 31 and 32 Uffington Road, Barnack - Construction of 2No. two-storey dwellings including associated car parking and access road. *No objections. SR departed the meeting after this item.*
- b) 21/00447/LBC – Kylemore Cottage, Uffington Road, Barnack - Demolition of conservatory and store, construction of two storey and single storey rear extension with balcony, enlarge existing doorway and replace with glazing to north elevation, and internal and external alterations and refurbishment. *No objections.*
- c) 21/00487/HHFUL – 11 Orchard Road, Barnack – first floor side extension. *The Council are concerned re potential loss of light to number 9. There are also concerns that although this extension cannot be seen clearly from the road or field, similar extensions elsewhere would be more visible and should be discouraged by not setting a precedent.*
- d) 21/00003/ENFBCN – Planning Complaint – temporary dwelling at rabbit farm. *Agree response to queries raised by Peterborough Planning department. No action required at this time as the matter is being handled by Peterborough Planning team.*

#### 5) VILLAGE MATTERS

- a) For the Clerk to address issues raised by Councillors
- i. *MB expressed concern at the use of Hills & Holes by mountain bikers and athletic training squads, which although well behaved, are causing potential damage to this internationally important nature reserve. Summer Warden to be made aware of issue. Lack of signage precluding such activities was noted. MP to raise with Natural England.*
